

DESIGNED BY . . . GOD: BREAKING THE PATTERN | GENESIS 5:1-32

The Fall affected everything. Adam and Eve's lives were never the same. Their oldest son murdered his brother in a moment of jealous rage providing clear evidence that sin had infected humanity. God's design was marred by the evilness of man. However, Genesis 4 ends with a ray of hope. Seth is born to Adam and Eve, and Moses records, "At that time people began to call upon the name of the Lord." Now, we will see God's design reestablished although marred by the Fall. We will see the consequences of sin and at the same time men who called on the name of Lord. We see a God who has not abandoned His creation but brings both justice and redemption.
