## 1 CORINTHIANS | CONTINUING A CONVERSATION ON TONGUES 1 CORINTHIANS 14:26-40

Instead of following Christ in one accord, the Corinthian church was misusing the gifts they received from the Holy Spirit and causing disorder and division. The gifts were to build the church up but instead their practice of using certain gifts was tearing the church apart. Paul corrects them. He explains that God is not a God of confusion, therefore the worship service should have order and build up the church. What principles should we keep in mind as the church comes together for worship and we consider spiritual gifts?
