

**The Evidence of the Triune God in Christmas |
The Name Above Every Other Name,
Philippians 2:1-11**

God, the Father received glory and worship in the events that surrounded Christ's birth. The Father was indispensably involved in the first Christmas. John wrote, ""¹⁶ "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life." (John 3:16, ESV) The Holy Spirit was also indispensably involved in the first Christmas. Matthew records: "²⁰ When he had contemplated this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, because the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit."
